Dobson Bridge

Built in 2000-2001, Dobson Bridge was, for several years, the G1MRA's showcase layout. It made its first appearance in November 2001, and was regularly exhibited in London and the south of England. In 2008 it made its way north and is currently held by the G1MRA East Midlands Group. With regular use, it had become in need of refurbishment, and in 2009 major work was done to repair the track. A programme of updating and adding more scenic details is in progress – the new footbridge is on display for the first time today.

There are three levels – a high level steaming bay, a double circuit and storage sidings on the lower level. There will always be something happening throughout the day, and various demonstrations take place on the layout.

Moordale - Stand 19

The G1MRA Yorkshire group acquired Moordale, an end-to-end layout from the East Anglian group in 2009. We have begun its refurbishment by ballasting the track, adding some scenic features and changing the aspect of its buildings from GER to LMS. It is an on-going process, which we envisage taking some time to complete.

Moordale is essentially an example of what can be achieved in a relatively small space in Gauge 1, and represents a small branch terminus and shunting yard somewhere in West Yorkshire, although you are likely to see locos from all eras, depending on who is attending on the day! On this layout, all operations are carried out by radio controlled, electric powered locos.

Guisborough Station - Stand 19

Howard Clough has brought his layout, which makes very rare appearances at shows – so we are delighted that he is here.

Together they make an impressive end-to-end layout over 50 feet long. Teams of four will operate the two layouts each hour, you will see a variety of locos, rolling stock and action. Lots of shunting, short local passenger and goods trains. There will be some clockwork gauge one engines running from time to time, and if you are very lucky, you might catch a glimpse of Thomas the Tank Engine, running a special delivery!

Gauge 1 Miscellany - Stand 32

This display of locomotives, coaches and wagons in various scales - 1:32, 1:30.5 (10mm) and 1:29, are all associated with Gauge 1. Both British and American railways are represented.

This display aims to give people an idea of what Gauge 1 is, and to emphasise it a DVD will shown of various get-togethers throughout the land, where it can be best appreciated - outdoors.
